2.2 Approval of agenda

Minutes:

2.1 Next steps in communicating with new families- handouts at parent meeting. A procedure for communication to those not on aula, handout at coffee mornings/Den Blå Fisk,

Follow up on student involvement in sporting and cultural clubs- introduce the various activities at thee next assembly with those that we used at the AGM. Two parents, thank you Geraldine and Marie-Armelle, produced a list of local sporting clubs as a reference for families. This wil initially be shared on Aula and added to in the future.

Further discussion on school trips- it was noted that students were not involved in the decision of where the Grade 8 trip will be. The new law on the child's voice (Barenets stemme) means young people need to be a part of the conversation. Grade 7 should be involved in the discussion of whether to travel within Denmark or abroad before next years trip is planned.

The changes to the bylaws have been approved by LK children's and school committee (BSU) and sent to other school board for a hearing process before going to city council for final approval.

Minutes:

- School start, student numbers- 180 total students, 18 new across Gr1-9, 20 new in Grade 0
- Vice principal recruitment- Brian resigned over the holiday. He has accepted a principal position at another school. A job add went live on 15/8 with applications closing on 31/8. Anneliese will represent the board at the interviews. Hope the successful candidate will begin 1 November.
- Exam results- a review of the exam results from grade 9 in May/June 2025 with comparison to national and international averages in FP9 Danish, Cambridge English, Cambridge Maths, Cambridge Science, optagelsesprøven, and further study destinations. Also discussion on overall school attendance rates.
- Playground and donation progress- will open this week, still seeking sponsors and donations to complete the funding of the project.
- Parent information nights- board member are to introduce themselves.

4. 17:10 Introduction of Report Grades in 6th and 7th Grade from School Year 2025/26

Description:

As part of *Folkeskolens Kvalitetsprogram*, a national reform coming into effect from August 2025, schools are now permitted to introduce standpunktkarakterer (term report grades) in 6th and 7th grade. The change is optional and can only be implemented if both the school board and the school leadership approve.

Lolland International School has a large population of international students and families, many of whom are accustomed to receiving academic grades from an earlier age than what is standard in Danish public schools.

Introducing report grades in Grade 6 and 7 will align better with international expectations and support academic transparency for students and families.



The teaching staff and school leadership are in full support of implementing this change, provided that feedback remains developmental and constructive, as required by the Ministry of Education.

Pros:

- Aligns with international grading norms and expectations.
- Improves transparency and communication about progress for the students.
- Better prepares students for upper secondary expectations (grades 8–9).
- Supports families relocating abroad who require documented grades.

Cons:

- May increase academic pressure for some students at an earlier age.
- Requires time and professional development of the staff to ensure feedback remains balanced and supportive.
- Needs clear communication to parents and students about what the grades mean.

Proposal: Does the school board approve the introduction of report grades in 6th and 7th grade beginning in the 2025/26 school year, in line with national policy, with an emphasis on combining grades with written or oral formative feedback.

Minutes:

There was a discussion on the pros and cons- good for motivation but not for those getting 00 or students new to Denmark who would receive -3. Students are generally in favour. Seen a important for families seeking to apply to school abroad. Grades must be given with verbal feedback and in line with skole-hjem meetings. Board differ in opinion whether to introduce grades or not. Correction about the description above-not all staff are in favour. A preferred model of grades from grade 7 from staff. Discussion over which year to introduce grades. Decision- Grade 7 will receive academic and effort grades this school year with an evaluation at the end of the year.
